or me as Director General of the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF) a key issue that requires debate and on-going dialogue is that of Women's Health specific to Muslim populated countries. In Islam, health is regarded as a great blessing with encouragement to gain further medical knowledge and to seek out improved treatments and solutions where these improve the lives of women, men and their children. We see in many countries improvements to our healthcare systems but all too often women and girls are prevented from access and utilisation of these health services. Barriers linked to poor education, social stigma, gender inequality and restrictions on personal freedom and decision making continue. The impact on women and their health can be devastating.

Too often misconceptions between religion, culture and traditional practices exist. Creating the opportunity and space to discuss these from differing viewpoints and perspectives can lead to positive outcomes. I had the privilege in September 2012 of bringing together Health experts, Shariah scholars, Parliamentarians and Practitioners to discuss and debate. The meeting commitment is a clear set of steps that can now be taken to progress this important topic further and ensure the necessary momentum exists for religious, political and financial decision makers to work together and seek improvement to the health and lives of women and girls.





igh level experts from more than 30 countries gathered in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia between 22-24 September 2012. The meeting outcome included a commitment to:

- End violence against women and girls including domestic violence, honour killings and abuse, neglect and degrading treatment by family or society members.
- Accelerate reduction of maternal mortality and morbidity through expanding universal access to comprehensives, affordable, quality sexual and reproductive health services. To advocate against child brides and marriage given the serious complications and high risk to health associated with this.
- Provide and promote family planning and birth spacing in particular for higher risk groups including adolescents, those of advanced maternal age and those who have had multiple births.
- Reject female genital mutilation as a violation of women's rights.
- Address HIV and the vulnerabilities that increase the risk of HIV transmission especially for women and young girls, this includes integrated HIV and sexual and

- reproductive health services, access to anti-retroviral treatment care and support and fighting stigma and discrimination towards those living with HIV.
- Amplify women's health responses in disaster, conflict and other humanitarian settings with a holistic approach to ensuring basic health care is provided, refugees and migrants are considered and risks in relation to violence and exploitation are minimised.
- Address other emerging concerns including cervical cancer cases and infertility.

Future Plan

IPPF working with other committed partners aims to:

- Mobilise greater involvement and social accountability of Islamic scholars and religious leaders in addressing the sexual and reproductive health of women and girls.
- Provide opportunities for Islamic scholars and health care professionals to understand existing fatwas and promote a unified understanding of Islamic practices in relation to sexual and reproductive health and rights.
- Encourage men within Muslim populations to be equal partners within relationships and to support the raising of their children.
- Build a network of civil society, professional associations, international organisations across related fields of health, sexual and reproductive health, HIV, religious organisations and humanitarian aid organisations to provide a common platform in support of women's health, role and rights.
- Document and communicate good practice in order to facilitate sharing of experiences.
- More widely identify opportunities to enhance the role and status of women within Muslim societies.

To assist in monitoring progress on the meeting commitments and to help accelerate support and resources a further consultation is planned for 2013 /2014.
